Fulbright Foreign Student Scholarship Program for 2011-2012

The Fulbright Foreign Student Scholarship Program provides candidates an opportunity to pursue a two-year Master's Degree in many fields in the United States. For general information on this program, please visit <http://www.fulbright.state.gov/>.

In terms of eligibility requirements, applicants for this program must be Syrian citizens or Palestinians residing in Syria. Students must be recently graduated from Syrian universities. Applicants must have excellent academic records and strong English language skills. Students of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, or students who want to pursue academic programs involving clinical work are not eligible. Students who have a Bachelor's degree from an English-speaking country or already have a Master's degree from any country, including Syria, are also not eligible. International Fulbright Science and Technology Award for 2011-2012

The International Fulbright Science and Technology Award is for Ph.D. study at top U.S. institutions in science, technology, or engineering. It is designed to be among the most prestigious international scholarships in science and technology. Eligible fields include: aeronautics, agriculture (entomology, plant biology, plant pathology, and soil science), astronomy, biology, biomedical engineering, chemistry, computer sciences, energy, engineering, environmental science, geology, information sciences, materials science, mathematics, neuroscience, oceanography, physics, and public health. Note that applicants must be proficient in English with a recent TOEFL score of 580 or higher.

The FLTA Program provides an opportunity for young English teachers from Syria, ranging in age from 21 to 29, to refine their teaching skills, increase their English language proficiency, and extend their knowledge of the cultures and customs of the United States while engaging in non-degree studies at a U.S. college and university.

Along with their studies, FLTA Program participants teach Arabic language courses, supervise language labs and conversation groups, and act as cultural and linguistic ambassadors. Participants in the FLTA Program add an energetic and up-to-date cultural component to foreign language classes as well as to student life on U.S. campuses.
